Aim:

To describe the challenges presented by, responses to, and the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in nursing homes

Design: Multicenter study with a qualitative design



Data collection:

Outbreak teams' minutes: March 2020 – October 2021; low study load

Output:


- Summary reports

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Sample description

Participating organizations	n = 41
Nursing home locations	Range: 3 – 70
	No. (%)
1 - 10	20 (49%)
11 - 20	17 (42%)
≥ 20	4 (10%)





Isolation and distancing measures (IDM)

Aim:

- 1. To investigate what IDM were implemented to prevent SARS-CoV-2 infections among residents in Dutch nursing homes
- 2. To identify challenges that were encountered

Data selection and analysis

- Manifest content analysis (2)

Residents among each other, staff, visitors


Building entry






"Some new residents are hesistant to nursing home admission. This has to do with visitor policies, but also with the lack of a tour. From now on, customized tours are possible."
