Objectives

To support the region in the development of LTC policies and systems, while promoting gender equality, by

(i) identifying common institutional, legal, financing and operational challenges in the region to provide care for older people; **IDB Inter-American WHO WE ARE PROJECTS COUNTRIES SECTORS KNOWLEDGE NEWS SUP**

(ii) supporting the development of policies, programs and models of interventions to address such needs, and

(iii) actively promoting the collection and dissemination of lessons learned.

Regional meetings (Aug\2020-Oct\2021)

- **1 Meeting:** August 2020 (n=50; 21 countries) Opening]
- **2 Meeting:** November 2020 (n=30; 12 countries) How to increase service supply: Costa Rica, Chile and Italy
- **3 Meeting:** April 2021 (n=50; 11 countries) Financing alternatives: Peru, Argentina, Europe
- **4 Meeting:** June 2021 (n=33; 11 countries) Formalization and certification of workforce with focus on gender equity: Uruguay, France
- **5 Meeting:** October 2021 (n=25; 12 countries)
- Certification and validation of care competencies: Spain, Chile, Colombia

- In line with our Vision 2025: a great potential to generate employment and support women to continue to participate in the job market.
